1st Ward City Councilmember – Jackson, MS

Carl L. Breeding was born in Indianapolis, Indiana on August 30, 1932. He graduated from all- Black Crispus Attucks High school in 1950. He earned a Bachelor's degree from the University of Indianapolis with majors in Education and Mathematics with minors in Chemistry, English and Physics.

He received a Masters Degree in Teaching Mathematics from MSU. He taught Algebra and General Mathematics in the Jackson Michigan Public School System for 28 years. He was a candidate for Mayor of Jackson, Michigan in 1971 and 2007. He was first elected to the City Council in 1997 and was re-elected in 1999, 2001 and 2005.

This year, 2009, he is a candidate for re-election to another four terms as Jackson's 1st Ward City Councilmember. Breeding has three daughters, two sons, 18 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren. Carl L. Breeding has been a member of Lily Missionary Baptist Church since 1959 and has resided in Jackson, Michigan, since 1959.
