Angela Sailor is the Coalitions Director at the Republican National Committee. Her Division is responsible for branding, mobilization and training republican advocates and new supporters. Angela was named Director of African-American Affairs for the Republican National Committee and Victory 2000 to support the Bush/Cheney Presidential campaign. In this capacity she served as the liaison to congressional, state and local African-American Republican candidates. In addition, she worked actively to build stronger alliances with urban-based business, community, educational and faith-based leaders across America.

Her political experience includes service as Deputy Chief of Staff to the U.S. Secretary of Education where she was responsible for strategic planning and policy implementation. As Associate Director of the White House Office of Public Liaison, Angela built coalitions through Presidential policy initiatives and strategic planning. Her portfolio included domestic policy that directly impacted the African-American and Senior Citizen communities. Key issues included health-care, housing, Social Security and welfare.

Angela also managed the Grassroots Advocacy program for the Detroit Regional Chamber of Commerce; Communications, Sales and Marketing Strategy for Black Entertainment Television (BET); and Sales and Marketing for Procter and Gamble.

Her legal experiences include service with Michigan Appeals Judge Jeffery Collins; United States Senator Spencer Abraham, Senate Committee on the Judiciary, Subcommittee on Immigration; Michigan Governor John Engler's Legal Division; and Detroit's Wayne County Commissioner, Kathleen Husk. Her media experiences include radio host with WGTZ 93 Dayton, Ohio, WCSU-FM 88.9, and as freelance producer with Fox Morning News, Washington, D.C.
