# **ABOUT THE CONVENTION**

The NAACP Annual Convention is regarded as the event of the year for those interested in advancing civil and human rights.

The NAACP leads a national dialogue on civil rights advocacy through workshops, symposiums, training and related activities. Nearly 8,000 people, including NAACP members, civil rights leaders, community activists, volunteers, business and political leaders, gather to explore and to share models of advocacy for strengthening communities.

This year the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People will hold the 108<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention in Baltimore, Maryland in the Baltimore Convention Center, July 22-26, 2017.

Baltimore – the colorful, diverse city that is Maryland's largest city and economic hub, is known for its beautiful harbor, quirky, distinct neighborhoods; unique museums and the world-renowned Johns Hopkins University Hospital to the east and the University of Maryland Medical Center to the west.
