VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2019 general election, **you will be asked to show a form of identification (ID).**

Acceptable forms of ID include:

being a personal acquaintance of the precinct officer
driver's license

Social Security card

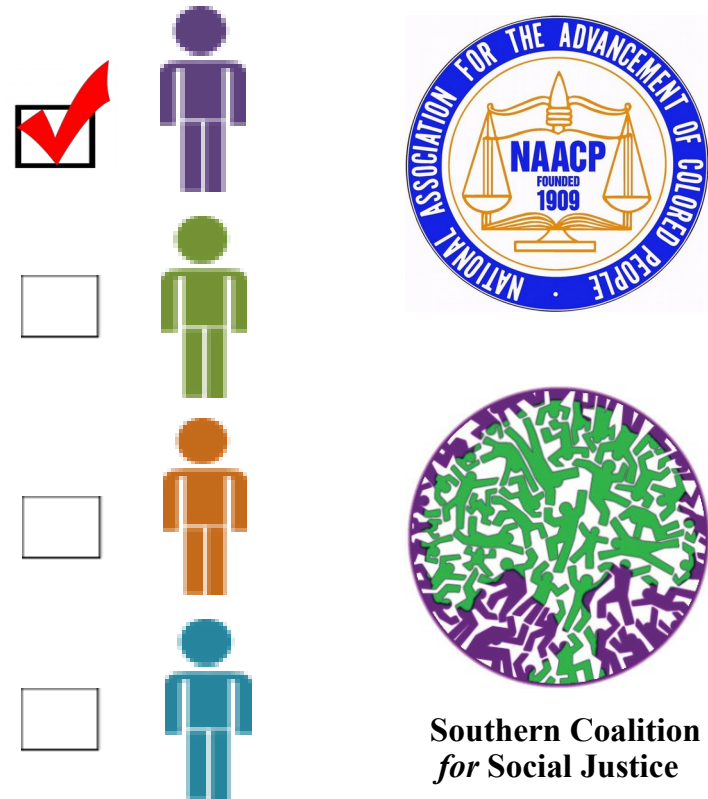
credit card

another form of ID containing both picture and signature

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the 2019 election, make sure you are registered online or by mail **by Monday, October 7, 2019** (29 days before Election Day).

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Kentucky, you must:

Be a U.S. citizen;

Be a resident of Kentucky at least 28 days;

Be at least 18 years old by the next general election;

Not have been judged mentally incompetent by a court and had voting rights removed; and

Not claim the right to vote outside of Kentucky.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, you must complete your sentence and apply to have voting rights restored by executive pardon from the Governor.

Registering to vote prior to receiving restoration of civil rights is illegal. Visit corrections.ky.gov to download an application.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, you must complete all parts of your sentence (including probation and parole) and then citizenship rights are restored and

EARLY VOTING DATES

Early voting is not available in Kentucky.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

In order to request and mail in an absentee ballot in Kentucky, you must be:

advanced in age, disabled, or ill;

military personnel, their dependents, or overseas citizens;

a student temporarily residing outside the county;

a voter temporarily residing outside of Kentucky while maintaining eligibility to vote in Kentucky;

incarcerated, but not yet convicted of a crime; or

prevented from voting in person at the polls on Election Day.

Absentee ballots can only be requested from the County Clerk's Office **by October 29, 2019** (seven days before Election Day) and ballots must be **received by 6:00 pm on Election Day, Tuesday, November 5, 2019**.
