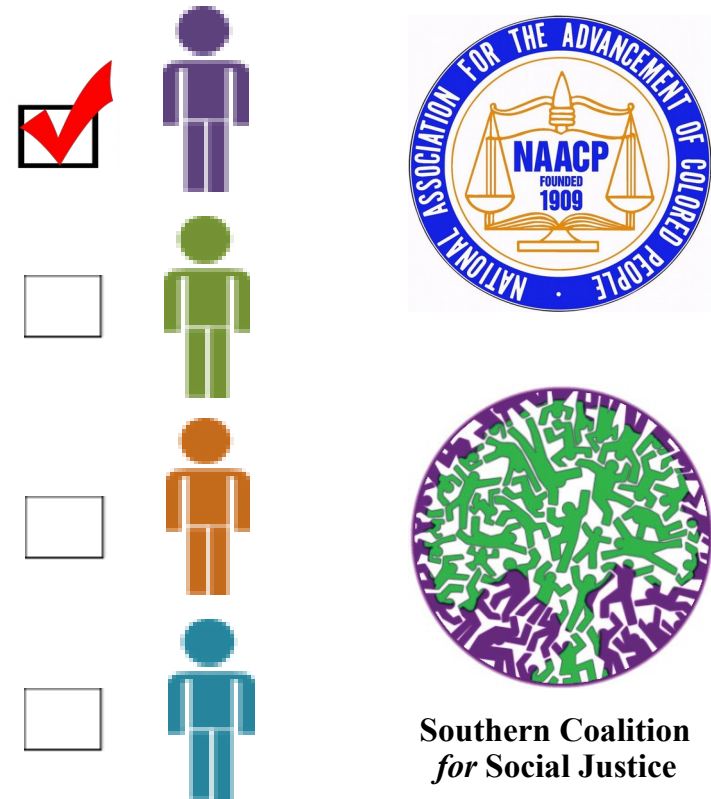

VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2019 general election, a valid form of **photo identification (ID) is required.**

Acceptable forms of photo ID include: driver's license; photo ID card issued by a branch, department, or entity of Mississippi, U.S. passport; government employee ID card; firearms license; student photo ID issued by an accredited Mississippi university, college, or community college; U.S. military ID; tribal photo ID; or any other photo ID issued by the U.S. government or any State government.

If a registered voter does not have any of these forms of ID, a free Mississippi Voter ID Card can be obtained at any Circuit Clerk's office in Mississippi.

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the 2019 election, you must register in person or postmark a mail-in voter registration form no later than **Sunday, October 28, 2019.**

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Mississippi, you must:
be a resident of Mississippi and the county, city, or town for 30 days prior to the election;
be at least 18 years old (or will be 18 by the date of the next General Election); and
not be declared mentally incompetent by a court.
If you have been **convicted of one of twenty-two crimes outlined in the State Constitution or by Attorney General Opinion**, you are permanently disenfranchised unless you obtain an executive order from the Governor or a Bill of Suffrage from the Mississippi State Legislature. If you have been **convicted of a felony**, you must complete all parts of your sentence (including probation and parole) and then citizenship rights are restored and you may register to vote.

EARLY VOTING DATES

Mississippi does not offer early voting.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Some registered voters are eligible to vote absentee because of age, health, work demands, temporary relocation for educational purposes, or their affiliation with the U.S. Armed Forces.

In-Person Absentee ballot must be **received by 12:00 pm on Saturday, November 2, 2019.**

Absentee ballot by mail must be **received by 5:00 pm on Monday, November 4, 2019.**
